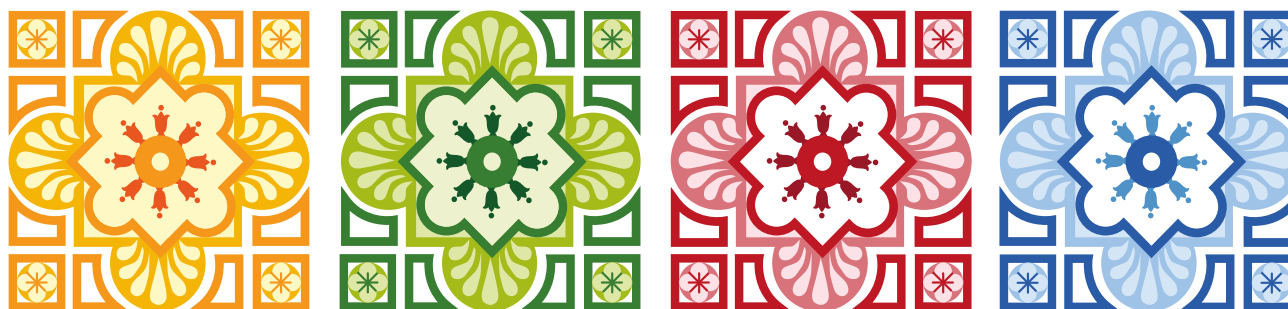

### THE VENERANDA FABBRICA

The Veneranda Fabbrica is the centuries-old institution charged with the conservation, development and promotion of Milan Duomo. Founded in 1387, its role is to take care of and restore the monument, promote the extraordinary heritage of art, culture and history that the Duomo holds, support liturgical activities and welcome the millions of visitors who come each year. From the Middle Ages to today, a collective enterprise that, from generation to generation, has shaped a unique monument.

### EDUCATION AND CULTURAL HERITAGE

Careful research of content and methods is at the core of every educational activity, adapted for every school level. Guided tours are designed to mediate the approach to cultural heritage and to encourage students of all levels to discover their ability to look at, think about, and enjoy art. Through direct contact with works of art, students can acquire the tools, interdisciplinary knowledge and specific historical, artistic and technical skills.

### A WIDE-RANGING OFFER

In addition to the itineraries offered for exploring the Duomo Historical Complex, thematic guided tours are also available for temporary exhibitions.

### THE HISTORICAL COMPLEX OF MILAN DUOMO

The Historical Complex of Milan Duomo is made up of the Cathedral, Archaeological Area, Rooftops, Museum and the Church of San Gottardo in Corte. By visiting the Duomo, you can follow a fascinating tour showing works of art from every era, from the Middle Ages to modern times. The ruins of the Baptistery of San Giovanni alle Fonti and the Church of Santa Tecla can be found in the Archaeological Area, where you can discover the city's late-antiquity history. Details of the Gothic architecture can be admired from the Rooftops, as well as an amazing view over the city. While the Museum houses treasures and statues, stained glass windows, and original architectural models that all illustrate the history of the Cathedral's construction. The Church of San Gottardo in Corte, found inside the museum, preserves traces of 14th-century Milan, such as the monument to Azzone Visconti.

### VIRTUAL TOURS



From school term 2021/22 are offered virtual tours of the Historical Complex of Milan Cathedral with the assistance of a qualified guide leading the tour on remote mode. Through a new digital platform students will be able to sweep down the Duomo's naves, venture between the Rooftops and rooms of the Museum, and go down the Cathedral's most hidden places.

## THE MONUMENTAL COMPLEX

Guided tours organised to discover the great heritage of Milan Duomo's Historical Complex. All itineraries are designed to familiarise students with the history of the construction and provide an understanding of the works of art through contextual analysis and stylistic characteristics.

We also offer teachers the opportunity to agree on and plan itineraries that build on what is taught in the classroom.

### DUOMO

Milan Duomo is the most important example of the Late Gothic style in Italy. It covers a surface area of over 11,000m<sup>2</sup> and is full of rich, impressive decorations. Construction began in the 1300s and continued for over six centuries: a fascinating monument where you can understand the development of the city's art and history.

### ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREA

Where the Duomo now stands today, an episcopal complex has been present there since the 4th century A.D. Archaeological digs have conserved the ruins of the Baptistery of San Giovanni alle Fonti and the Church of Santa Tecla, both important testaments to Milan's late-antiquity history.

### ROOFTOPS

Exploring the Duomo's Rooftops allows for up-close admiration of the flying buttresses, the 135 spires, the 150 gargoyles, and all the other particular details of Gothic architecture. The Rooftops also offer an amazing view over the city.

### MUSEUM

A fascinating place where you can admire beautiful works of art originally found in the Duomo. The Museum illustrates the history of the Duomo through the centuries: close-up views of ivories, architectural models, tapestries, sculptures and stained glass windows reveal details normally difficult to see due to their vertiginous positioning inside the Cathedral.

### CHURCH OF SAN GOTTARDO

Built in 1337 and renovated in the Neoclassical Period, the Church of San Gottardo in Corte still preserves the remains of a fresco from the Giotto School and a magnificent monument to Azzone Visconti by Giovanni di Balduccio. Also worthy of mention is the bell tower which was constructed in 1339 from a plan by Francesco Pecorari.

€2.00 Museum + Church of S. Gottardo

€4.00 Culture Pass (Cathedral + Museum + Church of S. Gottardo + Archaeological Area)

€7.00 Rooftops by lift

€5.00 Rooftops by stairs

€8.50 Duomo Pass Lift (Rooftops by lift + Cathedral + Museum + Church of S. Gottardo + Archaeological Area)

€6.50 Duomo Pass Stairs (Rooftops by stairs + Cathedral + Museum + Church of S. Gottardo + Archaeological Area)

The price of tickets are per participant. Tickets are access-free for two group leaders and for disabled students and their carers/personal assistants.

### GUIDED TOURS

The price of the guided tours are per group and vary depending on the duration. Groups can be made up to a maximum of 25 people (the maximum number of participants permitted per group may be subject to variation, depending on changes in the law regarding the prevention and containment of Covid-19).

It is possible to choose from the following itineraries:

- **60 minutes** €80  
Duomo **or** Museum **or** Rooftops
- **90 minutes** €100  
Museum + Church of San Gottardo in Corte **or** Archaeological Area + Duomo
- **120 minutes** €120  
Duomo + Rooftops **or** Duomo + Museum **or** Archaeological Area + Duomo + Museum **or** Archaeological Area + Duomo + Rooftops

Whispers and headsets are mandatory for groups inside Duomo (€2.00 per person). Tickets and whispers per person are to be added to the cost of the guided tour. Tickets and whispers are free for two group leaders and for disabled students and their carers/personal assistants.

### VIRTUAL GUIDED TOURS

The price of the virtual tours depends on the duration.

Choose one of the following options:

- **60 minutes** €80 - Duomo
- **90 minutes** €100 - Duomo + Rooftops **or** Duomo + Museum
- **120 minutes** €120 - Archaeological Area + Duomo + Museum **or** Archaeological Area + Duomo + Rooftops
